What's next for the Baby Milk Study?

By the end of March 2016 we will have seen all our families for their 1 year check and can begin to prepare the study data for analysis.



You have been fantastic at returning questionnaires and coming back to see us, so we have lots of information to process and analyse. We are looking through every tick box and comment you've made.... so far we have received more than 5400 questionnaires, which is a lot of pages of important information...it should keep us busy for a while!

Towards the end of the summer analysis will be complete and our study investigators will write up the findings as reports. These will be published in medical journals, presented at academic conferences, and sent to other interested parties, so that the findings can be used to inform policy at a national level.

BABY MILK INTERVIEW STUDY

Thank you to all of the mums who volunteered to take part in our additional interview study. We spoke to 19 parents in total.

Some of the parents we spoke to indicated a desire for better advice from healthcare professionals and this is an important message for policy-makers in the NHS and local and central government. The results of these interviews will also help us to interpret the findings from the main study.








Questionnaires missing in action?

Study questionnaires at ages 6 months and 1 year are a very important source of information, allowing us to examine the biological, psychological and environmental factors that may affect feeding behaviours and your baby's growth.

Don't worry if you were too busy to fill in a questionnaire at the time, but if you come across a questionnaire that you completed back when your baby was 6 months or 1 year old then please don't let that information go to waste. You can return it to us at any time by scribbling our Freepost address (below) on any envelope and dropping it in your nearest postbox. If you can't remember whether you returned a questionnaire, or if you would like us to send you another, then please call or email us and we will send you a new questionnaire with a Freepost envelope to return it.
