

NEWS FROM THE TEAM

With the number of volunteers growing, our Baby Milk Study Team has also grown. In July last year we were pleased to welcome Charlotte to the team as a new Research Assistant, working across the whole of Cambridgeshire. We also welcome Tom who is based at North Cambridgeshire Hospital in Wisbech. They are responsible for measuring babies' growth including length, weight and head circumference. If you lined all our babies up at baseline they would measure a whopping 143m! And they're growing by the minute!

Karen and Liz, two of our specially trained Research Nurses, also joined our team of Facilitators last year. Our facilitators work tirelessly to give parents the support and advice they need with bottle feeding and all the way through weaning.

The study office has also seen changes with Fiona joining as the new Study Coordinator and Gisela as the new Study Support.

With our team getting bigger we have been able to increase the number of testing sites we work at: Since September 2012 we have been working two days a week at the Oak Tree Centre in Huntingdon. We also hope to be able to measure families at the Children's Unit at Hinchingsbrooke Hospital in the near future. These are in addition to our specialist research facilities within the MRC Epidemiology Unit at:

- Addenbrooke's Hospital, Cambridge
- Princess of Wales Hospital, Ely
- North Cambridgeshire Hospital in Wisbech

We also offer home visits if needed because we know how difficult it can be to be a mum juggling a million and one things!
