




Directions to our Cambridge Clinic

Addenbrooke's Hospital lies to the south-east of Cambridge City Centre, just off Hills Road (which becomes the A1307 to Haverhill), and near to Long Road and Queen Edith's Way. It is a short bus trip from the Railway Station and the City. IMPORTANT - Parking is limited on site, and you are strongly encouraged to walk, cycle or use public transport if possible.

Bus services to Addenbrooke's Hospital

If you are travelling from the city centre, buses 1, 2 and 7 will take you to Addenbrooke's Hospital.

If you are travelling from Cambridge train station, buses 1 and 7 will take you to Addenbrooke's Hospital, or alternatively use the Busway A bus (see below). Buses from The Babraham Road Park & Ride site also come to Addenbrooke's Hospital.


When you arrive at the Hospital bus station, cross the zebra crossing and bear right to follow the road towards the Main entrance (passing the Emergency Department on your way). Enter the main entrance via the revolving door and head right towards the shops. Turn left to walk past the gift shop and hairdressers before turning right into a long corridor. Continue past Glaxo Smith Kline until you enter a large reception area with some lifts on the far right-hand side. From here follow directions as outlined below in: **Directions to our clinic within Addenbrooke's.**

Cambridgeshire Guided Busway:

If you are travelling via the Cambridgeshire Busway, please take the 'A', and request the stop on 'Robinson Way'. Addenbrookes Treatment Centre will be on your right as you get off the bus. From here follow directions as outlined below in: **Directions to our clinic within Addenbrooke's.**

To return after your visit, the bus stops outside Addenbrookes Treatment centre. Buses travel either to Trumpington Park and Ride, or to St Ives via Cambridge Town Centre.

How and where to park at Cambridge University Hospitals (CUH)

A 'pay on foot' car park system operates at CUH, with patients and visitors paying to park in specially designated car parks. All car parks at CUH have barriers at the entrances and exits; ticket machines are located in each car park for paying and validating the car park ticket before exit. The system is very easy, just like many shoppers' car parks in towns and cities around the country.

You can park in 'Car Park 2' which is closest to the Institute of Metabolic Science or 'Car Park 1' if 'Car Park 2' is full. The study team will reimburse the cost to park in either of these car parks.

To receive a discounted rate for car parking you will need to take your car parking ticket and proof of your appointment to the customer service desk in either Car Park 1 or 2. Therefore, it is important to please bring your appointment letter with you.

Illegal parking

CUH is a very busy site, and cannot risk roads being blocked by illegally parked cars. For this reason, anyone who parks their vehicle in breach of the published rules is liable to be issued with a parking enforcement notice (PEN) without warning. The current Fixed Penalty Notice Fine is £30 in the first instance if paid within 7 days.

Directions to our clinic from Car Park 2.

- Using the map below as guidance, please proceed up Robinson Way towards Keith Day Road.
 Turn right onto Keith Day Road (there is a zebra crossing to cross the road). As you walk
 down Keith Day Road, on your right will be bike parking area and at the end is the entrance
 to the Addenbrooke's Treatment Centre (ATC). Proceed through the revolving door and turn
 right. Walk towards the coffee shop and enter the lifts on the right hand side.
- Proceed to level three (please note this is the next floor up and has a lilac wall facing the lifts).
- Turn right out of the lifts and on the right you will find The MRC Epidemiology Unit, Institute of Metabolic Science.
- Please ring the bell (if no one is around) and present your appointment letter.
